Minutes of the Electronic Local Appraisal Committee Meeting of the Cyclone Ian Early Recovery Proposal/Project Document: 3-5 of January 2014

1. Introduction

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UNDP Resident Representative and UN Resident Coordinator, Ms. Osnat Lubrani, undertook a mission to Tonga in January 2014 to discuss with government the support needed to help the country respond to the recovery needs in the aftermath of Tropical Cyclone Ian that has devastated Tonga's Ha'apai group of islands.

Following her mission an official request from the Government of Tonga to the UN to support the humanitarian and recovery needs was received. As a result of the request, UNDP MCO prepared a project proposal for BCPR funding consideration.

On January 29, UNDP MCO received a letter from BCPR approving an amount of USD100,000 to assist with response and recovery efforts. The funding falls under category II of BCPR TRAC 1.1.3 to support recovery activities in the aftermath of natural disasters.

Subsequently UNDP prepared a draft project document and circulated to UNDP RR, UNDP DRR, all MCO programme staff and DRM specialists within the UNDP PC for comments.

2. Project objectives and outputs

The overall objective of the Early Recovery project is to with the objective to "Support and strengthen the capacity of the Government of Tonga to implement the early recovery process effectively".

UNDP's support to the post disaster recovery process will be in the form of the following three activities:

- i. Provide coordination support to the early recovery process
- ii. Participate in Post Disaster Assessments
- iii. Contribute to the formulation of Early Recovery and Reconstruction Plans.

The project will use Direct Implementation Modality (DIM) as per BCPR requirements for TRAC 1.1.3 funds.
