

## CONCEPT NOTE

<b>Project Title</b>	Trinidad and Tobago Climate Promise Initiative
<b>Objectives</b>	To deliver on the promise of the Paris Agreement, UNDP aims through the global Climate Promise initiative to support 100 countries to enhance their NDCs preferably by 2020. UNDP has prioritised three categories of countries under the Promise: ambition champions, Small Island Developing States (SIDS), and high emitters. All country support is demand-driven and needs-based.
<b>Background</b>	In the case of Trinidad and Tobago the 2020 action is designed to assist in strengthening data collection for the Agriculture, Forestry and Land Use (AFOLU) and Waste sectors to allow for emissions from these sectors to be included in future NDC targets. It is also expected to enhance gender considerations in future NDC submissions. These components together with a communications strategy and project support will require a total of USD128, 520 including 8% GMS.
