I. SITUATION ANALYSIS

A. The Background and Objectives

As being among the most vulnerable countries to the climate change, Turkey has already begun to face with serious risks resulting from the warming trend in temperatures. According to the surveys, the summer temperatures (mean and maximum) in Turkey over the past five decades have increased in the western provinces of Turkey, while winter temperatures have shown a decrease mainly along the coast. Simulations predict a mean annual temperature increase of 2-3 °C for Turkey by 2100.1 This situation seriously threatens water resources and lands as well as rural communities and vulnerable groups such as woman and poor through high levels of drought and desertification. On the other hand, as it is stated in the Country Programme Action Plan (CPAP) 2006-2010 of the UNDP, the environmental problems of Turkey concentrate around the distorted and inefficient exploitation of natural resources. These issues have long been given relatively low priority by the authorities. In addition to the relatively weak regulatory capacity, the institutional weaknesses of the civil society in terms of the mechanisms and platforms to reach out environmental governance processes and provide information for and involve in the decision making and remediation processes also played a key role in the contamination and scarcity of water resources, energy instability, inadequate waste management systems, agricultural contamination and deforestration. In this regard, strengthening the individual and institutional capacity in environmental governance in Turkey is crucial for the environmental sustainability. According to the "NGOs' Needs and Assessment in Turkey" Report by the Civil Society Development Program, the major problems of NGOs in Turkey are lack of fundraising, qualified staff, common platforms and services for NGOs, support from stakeholders and attention of the media. Moreover, a research study, "Civil Society Culture in the Voluntary Organizations in Turkey"2, indicates that the Turkish Youth has the lowest NGO membership ratio with 13.8 % within the Turkish population.

In this context, constituting nearly half of the Turkey's population, there is a need for strengthening the individual capacities of young people as well as the institutional capacity of the civil society for contributing to the solution of environmental problems. Turkey's youth, especially those in the less-developed regions of the country, do not enjoy the same financial and intellectual opportunities available to their peers in other countries. Social and economic disparities have visible effects on the quality of life for the youth population. Factors such as low quality education, lack of equal access to education (especially among young women), high and rising youth unemployment figures, the high prevalence of violence among and against youth are only some of the serious causes for concern. In this regard, Turkey 2008 HDR, "Youth in Turkey" indicates that the Turkish youth can not find opportunities and suitable platforms to participate in the social projects and activities of NGOs. Accordingly, as the HDR emphasizes, there is a need for both opportunities and support to strengthen the skills and capabilities of young people as well as developing mechanisms for the participation of youth, in particular young women, in decision making processes for human development.

This project builds on the achievements of the "Youth Increases the Quality of Life in Their Cities" Project implemented in partnership of UNDP Turkey and Coca-Cola Turkey between 2005 and 2010 and supported 46 youth projects in 33 provinces in the areas of sports, culture, environment and education. Among those, 20 projects were in the field of environment including the issues waste management, renewable energy, forests, water resources and wetlands. Throughout the project, the capacities of 80 young people were strengthened for project development and implementation on environmental issues.

With a renewed strategy and a specific focus on environment, the project aims to build awareness and strengthen individual capacity of youth in Turkey on environmental issues and strengthen the institutional capacity of the civil society to contribute to the environmental sustainability.

B. Beneficiaries

The primary direct beneficiaries of this Project will be the youth groups, NGOs, and grassroots organizations from Turkey. The ultimate beneficiaries will be local communities living where the supported projects are implemented. In addition to benefitting communities through the environmental outcomes of the supported projects, the Fund will also support the projects having a gender-balanced approach and taking into consideration the social impacts of their activities.

II. STRATEGY

It has been practiced by UNDP and its partners that the youth platforms have been driving force towards addressing local development needs including the promotion of key principles and values. Recognizing the significance of youth groups and their motivation to achieve individual capacity building for their increased role and responsibilities in achievement of development challenges, UNDP Turkey and Coca-Cola Life Plus Foundation Turkey have established the Life Plus Youth Fund to provide the youth groups between the age of 18 and 30 with necessary guidance, tools and resources to achieve this aim. In this regard, the project aims to contribute to the environmental sustainability and management of climate change related risks in Turkey through strengthening the capacity of youth and civil society in Turkey in following ways:

- Encouraging the development of awareness-raising, capacity development and research projects for the management of climate change related risks and conservation of natural resources.
- Supporting innovative, creative, participatory, sustainable, society-sensitive and gender-balanced projects of the young people that provide model solutions for environmental sustainability and management of climate change related risks and implemented in partnership with NGOs, private and public institutions.
- Strengthening the project development and implementation skills of young men and women via learning-by-doing, implementation support and structured trainings.
- Strengthening the institutional capacity of NGOs via implementation support, networking meetings and providing civil society with skilled human resources

The project will undertake the following activities and actions for the achievement of the project objectives:

Activity 1: Enabling the NGOs and young women and men in Turkey to address the climate change related risks and environmental sustainability through partnerships with public and private institutions and civil society groups

- 1.1. Awareness action through meetings with key stakeholders, media and cultural programs: The awareness of youth groups on environmental issues and the opportunities provided by the Life Plus Youth Fund will be built through websites, media, meetings with key stakeholders and the Rock'n Coke Festival. The youth groups will be particularly encouraged to develop projects for raising awareness and developing capacity of stakeholders and producing and disseminating information for decision making processes regarding the issues of the conservation of the natural resources and management of climate change related risks in partnership with relevant stakeholders...
- 1. 2. <u>Trainings on project cycle management for selected youth groups:</u> The applications to the Life Plus Youth Fund will be realized in two stages. During the first stage, the youth groups will

be invited to submit a preliminary application form covering the fundamental aspects of their project. After the evaluation of preliminary applications by the Technical Assessment Committee, two people from each of the successful projects will be asked to attend to a training on project cycle management and provided with feedback on their project ideas. Young women's participation will be quantitatively and qualitatively ensured in the trainings. Moreover, there will also be held workshops on social impact assessment and particularly on gender analysis for the integration of a gender balanced approach to the project designs. Following the training, the applicants will be entitled to submit a principal application form in which technical and administrative aspects of the project implementation process as well as the project design are detailed (For the selection methodology, see Annex I).

- 1. 3. <u>Financial support to the selected projects</u>: After the evaluation of the principal applications and selection of the projects to be supported by the Selection Committee, the project teams that receive the highest grades from the selection process will be invited to the negotiations on the necessary administrative and financial adjustments in the project documents. After agreeing on the adjustments, the applicant institutions will be invited to sign Grant Agreement and the projects will be financially supported by the Fund
- **1.4.** <u>Communication and media training for supported project teams:</u> Two young people from each of the supported projects will be trained on the relations with the media and communication with key stakeholders. The trainings will be provided by external communication experts, who will be recruited by Coca-Cola Life Plus Foundation. Young women's participation will be quantitatively and qualitatively ensured in the trainings.
- 1.5. <u>Implementation support in the field by expert team during the realization of funded projects:</u> The funded projects will be periodically visited by executing agency and occasionally by other members of the Project Board. The project teams and partner NGOs will be provided with implementation support by the executing agency throughout the project duration. If found necessary during the implementation support process, the project teams and implementing institutions may be advised to revisit the activities, budgets and outputs of their project in order to attain effective and sustainable results.
- 1. 6. <u>Increased interaction and exchange of knowledge between supported project teams through a Life Plus National Network Meeting:</u> The Life Plus National Network Meeting will be organized annually with the participation of the supported project teams and partner NGOs by the Life Plus Youth Fund and the teams and partner NGOs of other relevant projects that are supported by Coca-Cola Life Plus Foundation in order to enable exchange of knowledge, interaction and development of new projects. The participants will also be provided with knowledge on funding opportunities in the Meeting.
- 1. 7. Sharing of model solutions and project achievements with other youth groups, public and private institutions and civil society groups: The achievements of the model projects supported by the Fund will be shared in two levels. Firstly, the project teams will share their achievements with relevant public and private institutions, NGOs and other key stakeholders for policy development and dissemination of the implementation of model solutions. Secondly, the Fund will undertake communication activities to share the achievements of selected projects in order to disseminate the model solutions for environmental problems.

Relevance to the UN/UNDP Program

The Project will contribute to the **MDG 7** "Ensure Environmental Sustainability" through achieving the output of "strengthened capacity of youth and civil society for contributing to the environmental sustainability".

The project output will also serve for the achievement of **UNDAF** "Outcome 1: By 2010 strengthened individual and institutional capacity for both democratic and environmental governance at local and central levels" of the **CP** "Outcome 1.1. Increased individual, collective and institutional capacity for participation at all levels of decision-making" and "Outcome 1.3. Strengthened Management and Protection of Ecosystem for Environmental Sustainability" through

empowering the youth groups with necessary skills and tools for participation in the decision making processes regarding the environmental issues to achieve sustainability. The project also directly serves for the **Country Programme Action Plan (CPAP)** 2006-2010 of the UNDP which foresees the establishment of a Youth Fund.

Moreover, the project strategy which empowers the youth groups with necessary skills, tools and resources in the governance processes in order to contribute to the environmental sustainability while taking into consideration the social impacts of the project activities is directly in line with the comparative advantage of the UNDP in terms of holistic and cross sectoral approach.

The project also supports on-going projects of the UNDP Turkey in the fields of youth and climate change. Firstly, the project supports the "United Nations Joint Programme - MDG-F 1680 Enhancing the Capacity of Turkey to Adapt to Climate Change" which aims to develop capacity for managing climate change risks to rural and coastal development in Turkey through mainstreaming climate change adaptation into the national development framework, building capacity in national and regional institutions, piloting community-based adaptation projects in the Seyhan River Basin, and integrating climate change adaptation into all UN agencies in Turkey through strengthening the capacity of youth and civil society in Turkey on the management of climate change related risks. Secondly, similar to "Bridging Digital Divide: Empowerment of the Youth for the E-Transformations of Turkey", "I can Manage My Money" and "S-UN Fund" Projects, the Project addresses the need for strengthening the individual capacities of young people. Finally, the project shares the vision of GEF-SGP which can be summarized as demonstrating the fact that community action can maintain the fine balance between human and immediate environmental needs through providing financial and technical support to projects that conserve and restore the environment while enhancing people's well-being" and caries it to the youth groups in Turkey.

Relevance to National Policies

The development of a comprehensive youth policy has been an issue in the agenda of Turkey for a long time. There has been recently established a youth committee for the development of Turkey's first youth policy by the Minister of State responsible for Youth and Sports. On the other hand, The **9th Development Plan of Turkey** states the commitment at the policy level for the development of the social affinity of the youth, sensitivity and self-confidence in a manner to foster their confidence in the future.

Regarding the environmental issues, the 9th Development Plan highlights the commitment for the determination of conditions for protection and utilization of natural resources and establishment of environmental management systems by taking the needs of future generations into consideration in order to ensure equitable utilization of natural resources by everyone, preparation of regulations and policies as well as support for the investments in the fields of greenhouse gas emissions and use of water resources and realization of training and informing activities for public to increase the environmental consciousness. As the new chapter on environment was opened for Turkey in December 2009 in order to adjust to **EU Acquis Communautaire**, the adoption of measures for the remediation of environmental issues has been a pressing issue for Turkey.

While directly serving for the development of youth and increasing the environmental consciousness of the public, the Project also serves for the determination of conditions for protection and utilization of natural resources and establishment of environmental management systems as well as preparation of regulations and policies through strengthening the capacity of youth and civil society and supporting the awareness raising, capacity building and research projects on climate change resilience at local level as well as the conservation and sustainable use of natural resources.

Furthermore, in line with the **National Action Plan on Gender Equality** covering the period of 2008-2013 and implemented by the General Directorate on the Status of Women, which highlights the low participation of women in the decision making processes, the project serves for the empowerment of young women in the local decision making processes through providing them

with skills and resources, building the capacities of project teams on gender equality concerns through trainings and implementation support and supporting the projects having a gender balanced approach.



V. MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENTS



The project will be executed by Yasama Dair Foundation (YADA), in partnership with UNDP Turkey CO and Coca-Cola Life Plus Foundation Turkey. YADA will carry out administrative, technical, financial and secretarial functions.

YADA will provide contract and recruit a local Project Manager to be based in Istanbul. The Project Manager will be responsible for day-to-day management and implementation of project activities. The Project Manager will also be responsible for the provision of technical and administrative services and will manage project support provided by the UNDP CO and YADA. Please see Annex II for the Terms of Reference (TORs) for the Project Manager.

Once a project manager has been recruited and placed, YADA will provide ongoing support for logistics as may be agreed upon, including arrangements for adequate office space, in-country transport, and availability of local internet communications.

YADA, UNDP and Coca-Cola Life Plus Foundation will communicate regularly with during the term of this Agreement. YADA and UNDP will also collect information from all parties for reporting and impact evaluation.

Coca-Cola Life Plus Foundation will provide support for the realization of an effective communication strategy. Coca-Cola Life Plus Foundation will also support the organization of Life Plus National Network Meeting and trainings under the framework of a joint strategy developed jointly by UNDP, YADA and Coca-Cola Life Plus Foundation which will be reviewed and endorsed by the Project Board.

The Project Board will provide guidance and support to project management and counterparts during the implementation process of all project activities. It will also oversee monitoring and evaluation of the project and required reporting to the Coca-Cola Life Plus Foundation. The Project Board will be comprised of representatives from the State Planning Organization, UNDP Turkey,

YADA and Coca-Cola Life Plus Foundation. Please see Annex III for Terms of Reference (TORs) for the PB. The Project Assurance will be undertaken by the UNDP Private Sector Programme Manager.

The Project will be subject to NIM audit, and related costs will be charged against the project budget.

UNDP's Corporate Cost Recovery Policy shall be applicable for reimbursement of UNDP's direct costs for implementation support services.

VII. LEGAL CONTEXT

This project document shall be the instrument referred to as such in Article I of the SBAA between the Government of Turkey and UNDP, signed on 21 October 1965.

Consistent with the **attached** Supplemental Provisions, the responsibility for the safety and security of the executing agency and its personnel and property, and of UNDP's property in the executing agency's custody, rests with the executing agency. The executing agency shall:

SELECTION METHODOLOGY FOR THE LIFE PLUS YOUTH FUND

Applications for the Life Plus Youth Fund shall be carried out in two stages. At the first stage, the project teams shall submit a preliminary application form which includes the basic aspects of their projects, whereas in the second stage the selected project teams shall submit a detailed principal application form. The call for proposals and selection process shall include the following stages:

- 1. Call for Proposals: The terms and conditions for the application to the Life Plus Youth Fund shall be clarified in the call for proposals. The call for proposals shall include a detailed description of the functioning of the Fund, application process including deadlines, amount of Funds to be provided, eligibility criteria and evaluation and selection criteria. The call for proposals shall be published in the official website of the Life Plus Youth Fund and opening of the applications shall be communicated through media.
- 2. Technical Assessment: Evaluation of the preliminary applications shall be carried out by a Technical Assessment Committee. The criteria for the selection of the members of Technical Assessment Committee shall be as follows:
 - Experience on social and environmental projects with a particular focus on civil society empowerment for the solution of social and environmental problems;
- Knowledge on project cycle management (PCM) and factors built around the aspects of PCM;
- Experience in the project evaluation and selection processes in similar boards.

Technical Assessment shall function as a process based on objective criteria. During the technical evaluation the following scoring criteria shall apply:
