Discussions	MD: The objective of the proposed project is in line with the overall objectives of United Nations Development Cooperation Strategy (UNDCS) and new UNDP Country Programme Document (CPD). The project objective is also complementary to the priority transformation programmes of the government and MoSIT.
	This overall objective is in line with (i) reduction of import dependency, (ii) commercialization in priority technology areas, (iii) improvement of productivity and (iv) improvement of business and investment climate as included in the priority transformation programmes laid down in the Tenth Development Plan of 2014-2018. The project responds to the priority transformation programmes in the 10 th National Development Plan, "commercialization in priority technology areas" and "enhancing Productivity in Manufacturing Industry" through development of a model to improve technology use in OIZs. The overall objective of the Project is to contribute to competitiveness of Turkey through developing models that will enable

	Organized Industrial Zones (OIZs) to assume an active role in entrepreneurship, innovation and technology development ecosystem. The purpose of the Project is to clearly identify how OIZs can contribute to the technology development ecosystem of Turkey in entrepreneurship, innovation and technology and assess how such contributions will be institutionalized. The Project will target to reach OIZ administrations, enterprises in OIZs and other stakeholders in the technology development/use value chain.

Item 2	Presentation of the proposed project, expected outputs and activities
Discussions	PR: The proposed project has three components: The first component of Baseline Analysis involves a general assessment of current situation of all actors within the technology development ecosystem. The assessment will culminate in a synthesis report that includes the review of current legislation, field analyses and comparative review of international best practices and propose a model for TD/U.
	The second output of Piloting Phase will test enabling factors of the proposed model and results will be reflected to fine tune the roadmap for the proposed model. In addition, such incentivizing mechanisms as development of OIZ technology index will be designed both to disseminate successful pilots and engage OIZ administrations more effectively in technology development.
	Under the third component of Development of Institutional Competence awareness raising and competence building programs will be developed for the relevant institutions including mainly the Ministry of Science, Industry and Technology (MoSIT) and OIZs in line with the analyses but throughout the Project in a complementary manner to improve basic competencies.
Comments	KDO: The project is first initiative targeting OlZs. The project idea is evolved in 2011 and the design of the project is completed in 2015 with extensive support of UNDP. The project was developed in close collaboration with MoD and UNDP. MoSIT is extremely keen to move forward and very interested to have the outputs and supporting tools which will be developed within the Action. Since these will be key to sustain the results and contribute national priorities.
	CK: There can be some overlaps with ongoing projects of the Ministry and attention will be paid to avoid overlaps with ongoing interventions. The selection of OIZs is also important. We need to have a criteria table to be objective in selection of OIZs.
	PR: The project document has been prepared in close cooperation with the Development Ministry. MoD prioritizes this Action and look forward to working closely with the team. The selection of OIZs by the Project Management and/or Project Steering Committee in line with the results of baseline analysis is clearly stated in the project document. We will also look at the international best/successful

	practices and the pilot OIZs will be identified considering this.
	MT: The project responds innovation and technology priorities under sustainable development goals. It is important to integrate the global agenda and priorities into the project.
	PR: Baseline Analysis will involve review of strategy documents of the Ministry and UNDP. We will identify priority areas with the MoSIT and then review the international best practices as well as successful OIZs in Turkey to address these priority areas.

Discussions	MD: Project is proposed to be executed under NIM Modality with the MoD as the National Implementing Partner.

Item 3.b	Other: Gender
Discussions	MD: Gender sensitive approach should be considered in project's activities and outputs. UNDP Gender expert can visit the Ministry and work on concrete steps regarding the project.
Comments	PR: Areas of intervention to bring gender perspective in the project involve baseline analysis which will also include behavioral research and qualitative assessments, awareness raising activities and competence building programs.
Conclusion	Agreed
Action	A review was made in the activity plan with Gender Experts of UNDP and recommendations are taken and integrated into planning phase to develop gender sensitive indicators into the baseline analysis as well as relevant actions on the proposed roadmap.

Discussions	PR: A new staff will not be recruited for the project, UNDP Portfolio Manager, Portfolio Administrator and Project Associate will be mobilized for the management of the project. A cost efficiency will be ensured and synergy will be maintained between different projects. Also short term experts will be mobilized. MD: The role of the project board and project management team should be elaborated in the management arrangements.

Therefore there has been a delay to submit the Project Document to official signature.
