The mission objectives were:

- Facilitation of outer island workshops to integrate climate risks into the existing ISPs and to produce/enhance annual budgets (Sub-activity 3.1.2)
- Promote and build awareness and understanding of the Falekaupule, Kaupule and communities about TCAP overall objective and three Outputs.
- Provide opportunity for TCAP team to mainstream climate change risks, including coastal management, into ISPs.
- Translate climate change risks identified in the ISPs into microprojects that would reduce the community's vulnerability, hence empowering them to be more resilient (Sub-activity 3.4)
- Translate the ISP into English language (Activity 3.1.1).

10. Brief Summary of the Mission:

The ISP review team included TCAP Project Manager, staff from Department of Local Government and facilitators from the Nukufetau island community on Funafuti. The mission left Funafuti on 13 April to Nukufetau and arrived Nukufetau on 14th April. The first 3 days were spent on conducting household socio-economic survey. The ISP review and formulation of new ISP took place from 19th April to 30th April when the high chief and Pule Kaupule signed the document. A school visit was also organized on the second week to distribute and publicized TCAP.

10A. Findings

- 1- Briefings: Ulu aliki and his council of chiefs; Pule Kaupule and his council of kaupules, and community members were briefed on the importance of integrating climate change into their ISP.
- 2- While the community members knew about climate change and its impacts on their communities, addressing these impacts through the integration of development activities with climate change is a challenging field for them. The team facilitated in enhancing their knowledge on integrating climate change into development initiatives.
- 3- ISP review and formulation of their new ISP was completed in 10 days and the translation of their ISP took place immediately after.

- Kaufata II Nukufetau ISP endorsed by community and signed by the high chief final draft finalized
- Formulation of Multi-Year Work Plan for the ISP
- M&E matrix for ISP activities

10C. Expected Outcomes and Impact

- Climate change integrated into the Nukufetau ISP
- Integrated climate resilient micro-project will be developed
