YOUTH ACCESS TO FINANCE AND PUBLIC FUNDS FOR SMALL INVESTMENTS IN KIGOMA REGION CONCEPT NOTE

Background

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In 2017, the UN in Tanzania entered into a new area-based joint planning and implementation process that selected Kigoma region as an area of focus. The push behind area-based programming is the desire to reduce the disparitles between areas and groups, narrowing the gap through integrated, participatory and inclusive sustainable investments in subnational governance initiatives, resilience, education, health and livelihoods. Kigoma region was selected because of its development indicators, in combination with its refugee population, make it an area of concern from a human development standpoint as well as a human security standpoint, The UN joint Programme on Kigoma focuses primarily on the three districts of Kakonko, Kasulu, and Kibondo in view of their roles in hosting refugees and the need to bridge the gap between humanitarian and development support, and between refugees and the host communities. Secondary support continues to be supported in the other districts where participating UN agencies already have ongoing activities. The Joint Programme consists of six converging and cross-sectoral outcome groups, namely: sustainable energy and environment; youth and women's economic empowerment; violence against women and children, agriculture with a focus on developing local markets; education with a focus on girls and adolescent girls; and Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) in Kigoma. This assignment is geared to support the implementation of the Youth and Women's Economic Empowerment (YWEE).

Under this theme, the UN, in consultation with various stakeholders including Local Government, identified women and youth groups key entry points to empower youth and women in the Kigoma Region namely, (i) Gender Responsive Local Economic Development (LED), (ii) Enterprise and Skills Development and (iii) Financial Inclusion. Towards this end, different UN agencies, as shown below, leverage their expertise and resources to address the impediments to youth and women empowerment by developing a robust regulatory environment that responds to the unique needs of women and youth in Kigoma; unlocking domestic flows of capital for private and public sector investments which can increase access of women and youth to productive resources, markets and income generating opportunities and developing the capacity of women and youth to effectively engage in entrepreneurial, employment and market opportunities in refugee camps and host communities.



Kibondo, Kakonko, and Kigoma (urban) as well as determining the financial and non-financial needs of the target group.

The ILO is contributing and leading the component for youth access to finance and public funds for small scale investments. This assessment was focusing on support the implementation of the Youth and Women's Economic Empowerment (YWEE) and concluded:

General principles

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i) Need for guarantee fund

There is a need for a credit guarantee to incentivise the financial institutions to enter a deemed high-risk segment. The geographical location, population size and general infrastructural challenges make the region not as attractive for a pure private sector intervention seeking to maximise profits. The risk levels are high – not only of default but even failure to reach the profitability targets set out. As such, guarantee funds may offer the much-needed incentive, but may not be sufficient to attract the Fis. Furthermore, young people do not have collateral to offer and guarantee fund may provide the fall back required by Fis especially considering unsecured lending and the required provisions.

ii) Operating costs

Due to the foregoing, operational costs for Kigoma region will always be high without a direct return to justify the expenditure. Thus, such a project should be willing to explore not only risk sharing but cost sharing mechanisms as well. One example of structuring cost sharing could be placing guarantee funds in the lending financial institution partner as a cash fixed deposit (i.e., that accrues interest) but foregoing that interest as a cushion for the FI's operational costs.

iii) Non-financial services

The need for non-financial services cannot be over emphasized. The guarantee facility will not yield much unless there is an integrated package of non-financial services for grooming and developing the young entrepreneurs. Training, mentoring, and coaching should be an integral part of the program without which the guarantee fund may not be utilized. The training should definitely include financial education content to boost the literacy levels in that regard. Creative, appropriate and digitally based methods of service delivery should be considered in order to reduce costs and be relevant to the youths.

Three major types of training should be offered but on need basis - not an all size fits all approach!

- Business management program (e.g. practical marketing and business planning tools, budgeting etc)
- Financial education (importance of savings, goal setting, debt management, choosing financial services/products.)
- · Technical skills training: e.g. bee keeping, soap making etc

Modality of Engagement between ILO UNDP and SELF

The International Labour Organization(ILO) in collaboration with UNDP under the Kigoma Joint Programme in the Youth and Women Economic Empowerment Theme will jointly support establishment of a Credit Guarantee fund to leverage financing for women and youth groups economic activities in three LGAs in Kigoma namely (Kasulu DC and TC), Kibondo and Kakonko). The Fund will be managed by SELF Microfinance Fund in accordance with terms and conditions described in this LOA between SELF and UNDP, UNDP acting for and on behalf of Joint Interests and financing by UNDP and ILO that is will administer the funds to SELF MF on behalf of the ILO.

SELF Microfinance Fund will work closely together with UNDP, ILO and the LGAs in the identification of registered youth and women groups and in the monitoring of the groups' performance. Through SELF Microfinance Fund, the credit guarantee scheme will be established and leverage more lending resources to reach more youth and women by hedging the risk of default.

- Loan package sultable for women and youth developed by 30 September 2018 based on existing

- SELF Microfinance will also contribute towards the Credit Guarantee Funds \$1: \$10
- Four training sessions on SELF loans for women and youth groups conducted in the three LGAs by 30 October 2018
- Five women's groups and five youth groups provided with loans by 30 November 2018.
- Eighty percent of the youth and Women groups supported have started-up or improved their business by 31 December 2018
- Five additional youth groups and Five additional women groups have been reached as part of the revolving scheme.
- Access to finance for youth and women groups promoted to go hand in hand with non-financial support to the groups e.g. in terms of preparing viable business plans and identifying local and regional markets.
- SELF MF to adapt/develop a loan package suitable for women and youth groups.
- SELF MF will provide loans to the identified Youth and Women Groups in Kasulu DC and TC, Kibondo and Kakonko as per terms agreed with UNDP and ILO.
- SELF MF will collaborate with UNDP, ILO and the 3 LGAs in identification of formally known and registered Youth and Women groups notably through District Cooperative Officers (DCOs) and Community Development Officers (CDOs).
- SELF MF will conduct field visits to potential clients to identify their needs and provides information
 regarding the financial services and products to be offered. SELF MF will also conduct four training
 sessions in the three LGAs for identified potential beneficiaries and provide advisory services and
 support exchange visits for infant stage groups to learn from well-established and advanced groups.
- SELF MF is responsible for keeping the LGAs informed about progress and challenges and has to submit quarterly progress reports to both UNDP, ILO and the LGAs.
- SELF MF will ensure that the loans provided to the youth and women groups are revolving.
- SELF MF will co-finance every ILO/UNDP dollar as incremental funding to the guarantee fund.
