Min.01/01/TAC/20/04/2012: Prayer and Welcome remarks

The opening prayer was led by Rachel Ajambo.

### Min.02/01/TAC/20/04/2012: Remarks from UNDP

- a. Mr. Kwamya noted that UNDP and the Government of Uganda identified the normous challenges faced by the poor to actively and beneficially engage in meaning ul conomic activities. The Support for the Development of Inclusive Markets in Agricultu a Project was formulated to increase the participation of the bottom of the pyramid populace and small holder farmers to improve their economic wellbeing and livelihoods taking a value chain approach.
- b. He also noted that they key instruments of the project including the Project Management Team and the Project Board are in place.
- c. He therefore reinforced the need for technical guidance through the TAC, to provide guidance to the Implementing Partner and the project team. Its work will be to look and assess the substantive work done by the project and offer technical guidance at the strategic level.
- d. He noted that the project should be taking a value chain approach. There is need to define target areas as well.

### Min.03/01/TAC/20/04/2012: Remarks from Enterprise Uganda

a. Mr. Joloba emphasized the need for the technical committee in providing technical guidance but with a focus on the four project objectives. He emphasized the the TAC has a mandate of technical quality control and advise on any noted adverse ariances, to ensure timely and effective attainment of the project objectives and outcom is.

a. The meeting deliberated on the draft terms of reference for the TAC. They will be finalized in the next meeting.

a. The meeting, by consensus, selected Mr. Albert Ouma as the Chairman of TAC and Mr. Daniel Joloba in his capacity as the Ag. Project Manager, to be the secretary of TA.

# Min.06/01/TAC/20/04/2012: Presentation of the project document

a. The project document was read out to the members, focusing on the objective: of the project, the project outputs, the implementation team and the intended outcome i.

## Min.07/01/TAC/20/04/2012: Review of the Sector profiling report.

- a. There is need to give a background that links the report to the project objectives
- b. There is need to indicate the actual demand by each identified market leader for ach of the crops recommended.
- c. There is need to indicate current sourcing mechanisms for the market leaders identified and how they can be integrated or reinforced by the project.
- d. There is need to anchor the profiling to the DSIP and the project should be arch red in specific focus areas.
- e. The report should be scaled down to not more than 30 pages
- f. Kilimo Trust to deliver final report to the Implementing partner by 27<sup>th</sup> April 2012

# Min.08/01/TAC/20/04/2012: Review of the BCtA Mapping study report

- a. It was hard to distinguish between what was mapped and the normal business nkage as stated in output 1 of the project. They seemed to be similar, and there is need I for a distinct separation of the two
- b. The focus of the mapping should as much a possible, be focused on the identified sectors in output 1.
- c. The concept notes need to indicate specific things to do and reasons thereo They should also be clear on the role of the project and the partnerships embedded the ein.
- d. The conclusions were not strong enough. They were deemed to be general and c fficult to pick on by the implementing team.
- e. There is need to indicate the players, their potential demand, and the inner vative product that can be taken on by the project team
- f. The focus of the mapping should be in Uganda. The information on neighboring countries may not be appropriate in this mapping study

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- g. The focus should be on agriculture-based innovative business models
- h. There is need to highlight the tangible innovativeness of the business mode | being mapped beyond normal business linkages of buying and selling
- i. The criteria for the categorizing the BCtA needs to be documented in the report
- j. The communications, emails, minutes with identified corporate private sector eed to be filed for reference
- k. There is need to be deliberate on what the companies being recommended a 2 doing or will be doing.
- I. The report should be concise (not more than 30 pages)

#### Min.09/01/TAC/20/04/2012: Review of the Access to financial services report

- a. There is need for a clear linkage on the needs (finance, technology, market in fo nation) of the commodities selected.
- b. The references are too broad. They need to be localized to the sectors identified
- c. There is need to provide clear lessons where they are being tried and tested e pecially by small holder farmer groups
- d. The case studies should appear in the recommendations
- e. There is need to indicate the partners that can be engaged to package or o ent the services to the target beneficiaries
- f. There is need to specify the minimum level requirements needed of the target beneficiaries in order to access the productive assets.
- g. There is need to profile what the financial service providers require across the ifferent service providers' bands (SACCOs, MFIs, Banks, Grant organizations)

### Min.10/01/TAC/20/04/2012: Way forward

- a. In order to expedite the approval of work plans and budgets, the Responsible Parties will be reporting by the 25<sup>th</sup> of every last month of the quarter and the Implementing Partner will be reporting by the 27<sup>th</sup> of every last month of the quarter. UNI P would then finalize their comments by the 30<sup>th</sup> of every last month of the quarter and the final progress report and work plans/budgets would be with UNDP by the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of the first month of the new quarter.
- b. Kilimo Trust will send in the above revised documents to the Implementing F rtner by the 27<sup>th</sup> of April 2012 and the Implementing Partner will send them to the TAC nembers for advance reading by the 30<sup>th</sup> of April 2012.
- c. Substantive review of the Constraints to access to productive assets reports will be done after the completion and selection of sectors to be addressed by the project

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- d. UIA will invite a technical member of TAC to the Presidential Investors rou d table meetings (PIRT) under the local content technical working group. This will be stocject to approval of local content as a subject of discussion. It was agreed that Mr. Kwa nya will represent TAC and the project on this initiative.
- e. The next TAC meeting will be on 2<sup>nd</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> May 2012, at a venue to be decided
- f. The main agenda for the next meeting will be to discuss the revised BCtA ard sector profiling reports and take a decision on the value chains to be adopted in both output 1 and 3.
- g. The meeting was adjourned on 20<sup>th</sup> April 2012.
