Project Performance

Target 1:

1) 25 % of legislative recommendations and draft principles are developed; 2). 60 water management institutions' staff trained

Target 2:

1) Working Group for drinking water and sanitation established at the Basin level; 2) A detailed analysis on current status of Water Communal Services and Utilities within the Zarafshan River Basin conducted

Target 3:

1) Working Group for balanced water resources distribution established at the Basin level. 2) A detailed analysis on current status of water resources management in Uzbekistan in whole and in Zarafshan River Basin

Achievements on Target 1:

Modernized National Water Legislation.

The project has developed 3 legal regulatory acts as 25% of legislative recommendations and draft principles in accordance with changes made in current Water Law:

1) Draft Order of Water Use

2) Draft Regulation of the order for special water use permission

3) Draft Regulation on establishment of Water Protection Zone around Water Bodies

As part of capacity building the project trained 60 water management staff on above 3 legal regulatory documents were conducted training workshops.

Two roundtables with the participation of local administration representatives, city and regional representatives of the nature protection offices, communal services, industry, Karmana-Konimeh Irrigation System Authority (ISA) and Water Users Association and etc to discuss the possibility of gradual implementation of the principles of integrated water resources management at the basin level and agree on project priorities

The discussion was conducted with representatives of Ministry of Agriculture and Water Resources and Central Asian Water Research Institute (SANIIRI) to discuss the content of 2 legal regulatory acts with participation of International Consultant. Comments and recommendations towards improving these bylaws have been discussed and accepted by the MAWR.

Results achieved in the framework of the given activity, will have significant support to the planned activities in 2011.

Achievements on Target 2:

Integrated Strategy for Water Supply and Sanitation of the Zarafshan Basin

On the basis of the recommendation and proposals received at the round tables organized during October-November, the project has identified circle of persons, representatives of the organizations to participate in the working group on water and sanitation at the basin level.

The project has carried out analysis on the current status of drinking water and sanitation in the Zarafshan river basin. The results shows that the project will need to pay attention to more complete disclosure of the reasons of the pre-bankruptcy state of the municipal services and to develop practical recommendations for the establishment of the mechanism ensuring stable operation of these services.

Achievements on Target 3:

IWRM and Water Efficiency Plan for Zarafshan River Basin

During the last quarter the project has discussed with relevant organizations and agencies range of issues related to the joint activities within the working group which will assist in the preparation of the detailed project reports for each of the subcomponents and the further development of sectoral strategies. The results of the work will be discussed at the meetings of advisory groups that will be created in various areas under the component.

A technical report was prepared based on the requirements of the international consultant, who in turn developed an analytical report, which assesses the current situation in Uzbekistan in the planning, management, use and protection of water resources in the context of the implementation of IWRM principles and provides an analysis of international experience regarding the development and implementation of IWRM in other countries.

3. Issues

 Please specify the issues that were raised during the reporting period to the attention of the Project Board. Describe the steps taken to solve those (Management response in ATLAS).

Recent experience showed that the concept of IWRM is not enough clear to stakeholders, and consequently there is lack of understanding of project goals and objectives. One of the main reasons for that is the fact that in development of the project document was involved one group while in the First Project Board Meetings other group of people has participated. The project addressed this problem and was suggested to bring to the management's attention of the relevant Ministries and Departments to appoint a permanent representative to the Project Board. Taking into account the fact that appointed personals of the Project Board are high-ranking officials and are not able participate in each meetings. Thus, recommended to the project to pay special attention on the strengthening of the project coordination with the personals of the Project Board, through the joint activities of the technical working group will conduct frequently.

4. Project risks

- a) Please provide update on any changes with regard to the above indicated risks (e.g. risk occurred; no change and etc.). Specify the responses taken for each of those.
- 1. Lack of understanding of IWRM concepts may lead to unwillingness to cooperate among key stakeholders and other related organizations.
- 2. Lack of capacity of National Implementing Agency (Ministry of Agriculture and Water Resources) to promote real IWRM planning and possible intentions to implement IWRM as a means of one Ministry gaining power at the expense of other stakeholders.

Measures towards risks mitigation

- 1. The project through its PR and training activities will address these concerns in proper way. Intersectoral Technical Working Groups at national and basin levels will be regularly trained on the IWRM concepts.
- 2. The project will pay special attention to the matters of identifying, followed by justifying the advantages that National Implementing Agency could benefit from, if proper IWRM Plan considering interests of all water users, will be adopted. For instance via strategies developed under subcomponent 3.8 (Strategy for improving agricultural productivity and water use efficiency within the basin) and 3.9 (Strategy for improving the surface water delivery system and irrigation and drainage network) the project will enhance the position of the national implementing agency by justifying necessity of more adequate financing of the water sector for sustainable operation. Currently the water sector suffers from the lack of resources allocated through the state budget. On the other hand, the financial mechanism of IWRM plan will allow the Ministry of Agriculture and Water Resources use their available finance resources in the way what will promote saving of energy in pumping irrigation. In addition, the modernised water law will support the Ministry of Agriculture and Water Resources in promoting efficient water management policy. These advantages need to be properly explained to the National Implementing Agency.
