ANTECEDENTES:

El proyecto Apoyo al mejoramiento del abastecimiento de energía eléctrica de emergencia y agua potable en hospitales del sistema de salud de Venezuela, tiene como fecha de inicio 26 de junio de 2020.

Desde el mes de mayo se iniciaron gestiones de coordinación con el UNFPA y Ministerio de Salud, para que este último autorizara el acceso a cada hospital y acordar los mecanismos de participación de las Direcciones Regionales de Salud y a los directores de los Hospitales el proyecto, específicamente en la fase inicial para la realización del diagnóstico de los componentes de los sistemas de servicios a rehabilitar y en la segunda fase correspondiente al suministro e instalación de bienes e insumos y capacitación del personal.

En fecha 21 de agosto el Ministerio de Salud finalmente aprobó la estrategia de ejecución propuesta, mediante una reunión que se efectuó en la sede del Ministerio, con la Participación del Ministro de Salud y las Representaciones del PNUD y del UNFPA. En esta reunión el Ministro manifestó su aprobación respecto al alcance de proyecto a desarrollar, y la estrategia de implementación propuesta, en coordinación con el UNFPA y los equipos médicos y de mantenimiento de cada hospital. (Se anexa minuta de la reunión).

En el mes de agosto 2019 se dio inicio un proceso de contratación de consultoría para la elaboración del diagnóstico detallado de los hospitales, como paso previo para poder iniciar la fase de contrataciones para la rehabilitación de los hospitales.

El proceso se declaró desierto, y se inició un nuevo proceso en el mes de septiembre 2019. Actualmente se encuentra en ejecución el desarrollo del diagnóstico, necesario para la elaboración de las especificaciones técnicas y términos de referencia para la contratación de las obras de rehabilitación.

ARGUMENTACIÓN DE LA REVISIÓN:

En marzo de 2020, como consecuencia de la pandemia por la COVID-19, en Venezuela el Gobierno Nacional, inicio la implementación de las medidas de contención ante la misma. El Ministerio de Poder Popular para la Salud solicitó al SNU en Venezuela apoyo para contribuir con la dotación de los insumos necesarios para apoyar la respuesta del sistema nacional de salud.

En el marco de este requerimiento se presentó una propuesta para optar a la asignación de recursos del Centro de Respuesta Rápida del PNUD para responder a la COVID-19, nivel de crisis L3. La cual fue aprobada para la oficina de país, por la suma de USD 267.500,00; los cuales han sido asignados al Proyecto mediante la creación de un producto vinculado a la respuesta ante la COVID-19. Los recursos serán destinados a la compra de Kits de higiene y desinfección e insumos para el manejo clínico de pacientes afectados por la COVID-19 y también para la compra de insumos para apoyar la operación de las subestaciones eléctricas que abastecen de energía eléctrica a los 46 hospitales centinela, establecidos por el Gobierno Nacional como respuesta ante la pandemia.

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Request for Country Allocation of UNDP COVID-19 Rapid Response Facility Resources for L3 COVID-19 Crisis

1. SITUATION ANALYSIS

The outbreak of COVID-19 bursts in Venezuela in the midst of a severe social and economic depression. The economy has been contracting since 2014 and has been in hyperinflation since 2018. The non-payment of its sovereign debt and the sanctions imposed by Trump's administration prevent access to external financing. The country does not have fiscal space to face COVID-19. The necessary social isolation measures have worsened the already grave economic crisis and the most vulnerable population will be the most affected. The economic crisis has seriously worsened the infrastructure and operation of the health system. Emigration of many health professionals, due to low salaries, aggravates the situation. Urgent measures are required to face the health emergency and mitigate the economic effects of the pandemic on the vulnerable population.

2. PROJECT OUTPUTS AND ACTIVITIES

As part of the measures Venezuela is taking to prevent an outbreak and under the UNDP's Global COVID-19 Programme Offer related to Health System Support, the Government has presented to the United Nations System a detailed list of the requirements. This component has been prioritized to be addressed in coordination with other UN agencies in the country.

With a request of \$250,000.00 and in order to create more resilient health services, it is necessary to support the acquisition of medical and non-medical requirements to support immediately the Government capacity for health infrastructure improvement. Medical and non-medical supplies are considered. MEDICAL: basic supplies for patients, protection and hygiene of medical personnel and waste management (gloves, gowns, coveralls, caps, mask, oxygen mask, suction probes, valves, parts for ventilators, pumps, multi-parameter monitors. for doctors, nurses and technicians.

NON-MEDICAL: hospital hygiene kit, disinfecting solutions, gloves, mops, mop-washing trolleys, protective clothing for cleaning staff, brushes, shovels, plastic boots, and others).

As electricity is vital to medical attention and patient care equipment functioning, special attention will be given to ensure that available power plants are operational at their maximum capacity with the procurement of specialized materials and devices to increase immediately the operation of energy systems in hospital for the COVID-19 outbreak (sockets, batteries power stations).

Two outputs are proposed:

1. Support for procurement of necessary medical supplies prioritized by the Ministry of Health and non-medical supplies for the disinfection of spaces destined to the attention of the COVID-19:
2. Support for procurement of specialized material to increase the operation of energy systems in 43 of the 46 nationwide hospitals and centers foreseen to provide care for COVID-19:

With this immediate response, UNDP Venezuela supports the country capacities in the pre-surge stage of the COVID-19, open the opportunity of working on some initiatives and resource mobilization with private sector, other UN agencies, government cost sharing and other donors, when feasible and allows us to encourage resilience and to reduce the chance for new inequalities that for sure will have an impact in a short, medium and long time.

As women are hit harder by the health, economic and social impacts of the COVID-19 outbreak, mainstreaming gender (with the proper collecting of data and other relevant information) will be done to safeguard women as frontline responders, health professionals, volunteers, and crisis managers. Evidence will be recorded to register the products, percentage and amounts for female first responders. Although to date (March 29th) national statistics show no cases of COVID-19 infection in pregnant women, national policy supports and makes attention to this group a priority. For this case also, evidence will be recorded.

3. MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENTS

As for procurement processes the funds will be managed by UNDP Venezuela under the Programme and Operations Policies and Procedures under exceptional crisis. When feasible, funds from the private sector or other donors will be also guided by the criteria of effective response to emergencies.
